Now for Charvet, who graduates this summer with a PhD in Business Administration from Ohio State, moves from a fifty win playing

career in the NCTTA to the executive board as treasurer of the organization. "The best contribution I could make to the sport would be to help NCTTA further grow and accomplish its goals", said Charvet in his statement of intent, "college table tennis is something I am very passionate about, and will remain close to, as I am merely switching sides." Charvet will be missed not only at Ohio State but in the entire Ohio division. "I think he is a really dedicated guy" said Chris Oseredczuk, the North Ohio Division Director, "he has been a huge facet to the division." One thing is for sure, the NCTTA is getting a very qualified person as the next treasurer. "As treasurer though, the first priorities are to make sure the NCTTA does well financially; efficiency, transparency, smart use of funds are important." As for what's next personally for Charvet, he will be moving to Boston and start working at Northeastern University.
